**Position description:** The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, University of British Columbia, invites applications for a full-time Research Associate, based at the \_\_\_Wellington Laboratory, 5<sup>th</sup> floor DMCBH, 2215 Wesbrook Mall

The successful candidate will assist the principal investigator in conducting research investigating the pathogenesis of Alzheimer's disease and Traumatic Brain Injury using *in vitro* and *in vivo* models. Prioritized areas of expertise include leadership roles in evaluating candidate therapeutics *in vivo* and *in vitro*, mentoring graduate students, undergraduates and technicians, and rapidly advancing collaborative projects with external groups.

Other responsibilities will include presentation of findings, helping to prepare grant proposal applications and maintenance of meticulous records. Additional duties may include teaching appointments and research project development.

The incumbent will work under minimum supervision with a wide range of responsibilities, including execution of the above-mentioned type of experiments, also ultimately assisting in the training of graduate students, undergraduate students, and postdoctoral fellows.

Eligibility requirement: Interested individuals with a PhD or MD/PhD, a strong publication record and excellent academic credentials are encouraged to apply. Experience in drug development is preferable/required.

This is a one year appointment and depending on funding and successful progress of the research it may be renewed for additional years.
